



## WELCOME TO TOASTMASTERS YOUTH LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

Here is a breakdown of the roles that are filled at each meeting by our members, and what they do.

<b>Coordinator</b> Helps students understand meeting roles and provides educational portions of the meeting, such as speech development.	<b>Speakers – Speech Topics</b> Example: the ‘Ice breaker’ 4-6 minute speech telling the group about you, personal story that has an opening, middle and conclusion.
<b>Toastmaster</b> The Toastmaster is a meeting's director and host. They choose the theme for the meeting and introduce the speakers.	<b>Evaluators</b> Provide verbal and written feedback to meeting speakers. Something good, areas of improvement, something you loved.
<b>Grammarians</b> The Grammarian chooses our ‘word of the day’, counts “ums and ahs” and notes any overused words or filler sounds.	<b>Table Topics Master</b> Chooses a variety of impromptu speaking topics, usually based on the theme, for speakers to choose from.
<b>Timer</b> The Timer is responsible for monitoring the time of each of the meeting segments and speakers.	<b>Table Topics Speaker</b> Get ready to practice impromptu speaking. In 1–2 minutes deliver a speech or debate position on a random topic.
<b>Speakers</b> Members sign up to complete 2-3 speeches over the next 8 weeks.
